The Journal of Society in Kashmir (Call for Papers)

About the Journal

Journal of Society in Kashmir (JSK) is an annual journal with ISSN published by Department of Sociology, University of Kashmir, Srinagar. The Journal publishes original research articles for local, national and international audiences. It is a peer-reviewed annual journal published in August, every year. The journal intends to provide a platform for publication of articles from academicians, teachers, and scholars. It also intends to encourage the work of young researchers who are not yet established in the profession. It generally focuses on scholarly articles, current information on research and development and contributions relevant to sociology, Kashmir Society and other related areas. Submissions are accepted from October to January every year. All articles will be peer-reviewed by Editorial Board and published only on acceptance.

Guidelines for Contributors

The journal accepts papers of original research which are not under consideration by any other journal or Conference proceedings etc. The researchers intended to submit their papers for publications in the journal should use the following guidelines:

1. The paper should include an abstract (not less than 100 words and not more than 300 words) highlighting problem, methodology and findings with 3 to 5 key words.
2. The cover page should contain the title of the article, full name, affiliation and address of the author/s (official and Email, ID).
3. Papers for publication should contain 4000 to 5000 words and sent in duplicate (one hard copy and one soft copy) and text typed double spaced only on one side of A4 size paper.
4. The soft copy should be submitted in MS-Word, PDF. The figures and tables should be neat and clean, numbered in Roman numerals and must be of professional quality ready to reproduce and be submitted as a separate graphic file (GIF, JPG, or PNG)
5. JSK follows the endnote pattern. Serialize all explanatory notes in the sequence in which they are referred to in the text (using numbered superscripts) for place them at the end of the text under notes, but before references. Endnote must not be used for bibliographic purposes.
6. Cite sentence or words taken from other works with single quotation marks; use double quotation marks only within quotations. Separate quotation exceeding 50 words from the text and indent them on the left. Unless the entire sentence is part of the quotation, the punctuation must remain outside the quotation marks.
7. Use British rather than American spelling (labour, not labor; programme, not program. Similarly use 's' rather than 'z' in 'ise', 'ising', 'isation' words.
8. Authors should follow 'APA' (American Psychological Association) style for citations and references.
